7th October: Our Lady of the Rosary: The feast of the Holy Rosary was

instituted by Pope Pius V to celebrate the anniversary of the defeat of the Ottoman fleet at the battle of Lepanto on the first Sunday in October 1571, and was ascribed in part to the prayers and processions of the Rosary confraternity in Rome. Later the feast was moved to the fixed date of 7 October, as a reminder of the power of the Rosary Prayer to aid us in overcoming many of the tribulations in life. **Blessing of Rosary Beads will take place after the** 

## Monday Morning Mass.

9th October: St John Henry Newman: (1801 -1890), Converted from Anglicanism to Catholcism on the 9th October 1845, Priest, Founder of the Birmgham Oratory, He was an influential writer on many subjects, most notably the development of Christian doctrine, the true understanding of conscience, faith and reason, the role of the laity, and university education, subsequently



founding UCD, Dublin, Raised to Cardinal in 1879 by Pope Leo XIII. Canonised a saint in 2019.

12<sup>th</sup> October: Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991-2006). Blessed Carlo is known for his passionate devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and an aptitude for computer programming. He died on Oct. 12, 2006, of leukemia at the age of 15 after offering his sufferings for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Church. His relics drew large crowds to St Mary's, Navan recently "Carlo speaks to the hearts of many young people, The reason for this is to be found in the fact that, beneath all the banalities of life, there always remains within us a spark of good that God knows how to rekindle with a new flame.
