## Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord (6th January)

Johnstown 9:30am

#### St Mary's Navan 8:00am, 10:00am and St Olivers 7:30pm

The celebration of the great feast of the Epiphany, a Holy Day of Obligation celebrates the arrival of the Magi (The Three Wise Men or Three Kings) to Bethlehem representing all the nations of the world coming to meet the Lord. The word Epiphany means a revealing or manifestation and denotes the nations coming

to worship Christ. Traditionally given as 3 in number because of their gifts, and depicted in art as three ages of humanity (Youth,

Middle Aged and Elderly- notice the length and

colours of their beards), and in skin tone the three known continents of the ancient world (Europe, Africa and Asia). The gifts that they present to the Infant Jesus also have symbolic meaning:

Gold: pointing to royalty and indicating that Jesus is King

**Frank-Incense:** offered by a priest in worship; it tells that Jesus our Lord is God.

Myrrh: A pungent strong-smelling ointment, used to anoint the body after death, foreshadowing the sacrifice of Jesus on Good Friday. It was this spice that brought to the tomb on Easter Sunday morning.

This beautiful feast helps us to realise that all people of every age and of every place are invited to know the love of God revealed in the Lord Jesus Christ, our Saviour. For Eastern Christians, today is the day in which the celebrations for Christmas occur and presents are exchanged.

**Epiphany Blessing of Homes with Chalk**. The month of January is a traditional time for homes to be blessed in a parish, (Which can be arranged through the Parish Office) and one of the ways to

bless one's home is to make an inscription with chalk over the doors of the house, with the inscription above: the Year 2025, and the names of the 3 Magi, Caspar, Melchior and Balthazzar with their initials making an acronym for Christus Mansionem Benedicat "May Christ bless this house". The blessing of Chalk will take place after Mass on Monday, and will be available at the Crib to take home.
