Advent: The beautiful season of Advent lasting about 4 weeks, captures the essence of our Christian hope, arising from the Article of the Apostles Creed that states *"He (Christ) will come again to judge the living and the dead, and his Kingdom will have no end."* Do we truly live the hope that we will see Christ face to face, who came as that baby in Bethlehem, who still comes to us in the Sacraments and the life of the Church? Advent then is a time of purifying hope, by looking forward to the coming of Christ our King in glory at the end of time, by recalling the yearning expectation of the People of God for His first coming, as a baby in Bethlehem. There are many ways to live this season of hope: A Family Advent Wreath and the candles lit each Sunday, perhaps an extra Mass during the week, Dedicated

Family Prayer, learning some of the great Advent Hymns (there's more than just one!), the Sacrament of Confession, etc. There's even some good Advent Recipies to make to celebrate the season (or buy if easier!). St Mary's Parish shop have some great resources available for Advent.

**Christkindl:** The original Kriskindl (German for Christ Child) was not a once-off gift-giving for Christmas but an Advent long Custom! Each member of the family is drawn by lot, and from the start of Advent until Christmas Day, the person selected is in the special care of the selectee! They must do many little favours for their ChrisKindl without ever being found out:- e.g. a bed being made, a chore being done, a treat left for them, a note to say they were prayed for that day, a letter to say how much they are loved signed 'Chriskindl', etc. The idea is that the person being cared for becomes like the little Christchild of Bethlehem, reminding us all that "*Whatsoever you do to the least of these, you do to me*".
