

## • 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent - St John the Baptist

The appearance of St John the Baptist in the Gospel on this the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent is a key feature of the spirituality of Advent and that great call of his to 'Prepare a way for the Lord'. These precious few days of Advent can slip by quite quickly with preparations other than spiritual ones, yet the invitation to examine the place we give to the Lord is at the heart of these days, in order that Christmas may bestow it's true and lasting blessing upon us. A visit to the Church during the week, an extra weekday Mass, reading a spiritual book or magazine, praying with the gospel accounts

of the Birth of Jesus can be moments of great spiritual benefit this Advent. It is also a great time to approach the Sacrament of Confession and Reconciliation, as we prepare to welcome Christ, whom the angel announced to Mary as "He will save His people from their sins".

• Preparing for Christmas: Confessions will be available all day on Monday 23rd Dec. from 8:30am until 9pm in St Mary's Church. Visiting priests will assist from 12noon onwards. Confession also available every Saturday evening in Johnstown from 7:10pm.

The Celebration of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary – is in other years a Holy Day of Obligation, but as the Advent Sunday celebrations take precedence over all other feasts, the celebration is moved to Monday, and loses it's obligatory status this year. The 9:30am Mass on Monday will be the celebration of the Immaculate Conception as we honour Our Lady being preserved from the first moments of her existence from Original Sin, but is not a Holy Day of Obligation, yet still is a day of opportunity to praise God for the wonders of His mighty love. The dogma of the Immaculate Conception was solemnly declared an Article of Faith by Blessed Pope Pius IX in 1854.

The children preparaing for First Confession and First Holy Communion will bring their baby Jesus from their homes and from the school cribs as well to be blessed - and asking the Lord to bless our homes with peace and joy this Christmas as we make a place ready in our cribs to receive Him.

• Thursday, 12th Dec.- St Finian - Patron Saint of the Diocese of Meath

St Finian of Clonard, said to have been born near New Ross and after studies in Tours, France and Llancarfan Wales, founded a monastery in Clonard, Co. Meath about 520AD and it became an important educational centre. So much so, that St Finian was known as the 'Teacher of the Saints of Ireland'. His monastic foundation eventually became part of two other dioceses which were merged at the Synod of Rathbreasail in 1111AD, taking much of the shape of the old Kingdom of Meath, and became known as the Diocese of Meath. St Finian pray for us. Mass in Johnstown at 9:30am for the feast.
