• Election of His Holiness Pope Leo XIV:

With joy, we saw the white smoke rising from the chimney of

the Sistine Chapel on Thursday evening, and then

Cardinal Dominique Mamberti appeared on the

balcony of St Peter's and proclaimed "Annuntio vobis gaudium magnum - Habemus Papam - I announce to you news of great joy, WE HAVE A POPE" and continued "Eminentissimum ac reverendissimum Dominum Robertum Franciscum Sanctae Romane Ecclesiae Cardinalem Prevost qui sibi nomen imposuit Leonem XIV" - The most eminent and most reverend lord, Lord Robert Francis, Cardinal of the Holy Roman Church Prevost, who has taken the name Leo 14th. Many wonder about the choice of the new papal name, and for that we may look

at those who have chosen the name before him, including Pope Leo the Great

HABEMUS PAPAM

(400-461) whose defended the people of Rome during the time of the invasions of Attila the Hun, was an able theologian who defended the nature and identity of Christ, and the fundamental dignity of Christians. Fast forward to Pope Leo XIII (1810-1903) who is best remembered for his groundbreaking encyclical "Rerum Novarum" which highlighted the dignity of and rights of workers, and set the ground work for growth of Catholic Social Teaching and action in the social sphere.

Upcoming Dates for Pope Leo XIV:

May 11th - Regina Caeli Prayer and Address to the Faithful 11am (Irish time), St Peter's Square

May 12th - Meeting with the press and media from around the world.

May 16th - Meeting with the Ambassadors of the Diplomatic Missions to the Holy See

May 18th – Solemn Mass for the beginning of His Pontificate, and greeting with World Leaders following Mass. During this Mass, Pope Leo will receive the Pallium, the band of lamb's wool worn over his shoulders symbolising his call to be the chief shepherd, after the heart of Jesus the Good Shepherd, and will place the Fisherman's ring symbolising the central call of Jesus to Peter, to the Disciples and all Christians to become Fishers of people.

We pray God's abundant blessings on Pope Leo as he takes upon his shoulders the care for the Church and the world. "You have called me to carry that cross and to be blessed with that mission, and I know I can rely on each and every one of you to walk with me as we continue as a church, as a community, as friends of Jesus, as believers, to announce the good news, to announce the Gospel,"- Pope Leo XIV.
