●First Holy Communion

Congratulations to our young parishioners from Holy Trinity School, Lismullen, who received the Lord Jesus Christ in the Blessed Eucharist as they made their First Holy Communion this weekend. As they take their place among God's Holy People at Mass each Sunday may they grow in the love and likeness of Christ our Saviour. We are very grateful for the support of the teachers and staff of Lismullen Parish School for helping to prepare the children for this special moment in their lives, especially the children's teachers: Ms. Finnegan and Ms Brady, the childen's SNA's and all the teachers and staff of the Lismullen School.

On Friday, the children from St. Mary's Special School will receive their First

Holy Communion at 11am.

Crest of Pope Leo XIV: The Papal Crest of our new Holy Father has been published earlier this week. The central heraldic shield is surmounted by the Crossed Keys of St Peter (Matthew 16:19) symbolising the authority given by Christ to St Peter and his successors that "whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth, shall be considered loosed in heaven. The Mitre is the episcopal symbol in this case as Bishop of Rome, and the triple stripes represent the pope's role as "the father of kings, governor of the world and Vicar of Christ". The shield is split diagonally with the blue field evoking "the heights of the heavens and is

distinguished by its Marian significance, with the lily (Fleur-de-Lis) appearing as the classic symbol of the Blessed Virgin Mary." The opposite field containing the heart enflamed and pierced by an arrow, which is the emblem of the Order of St. Augustine, of which Pope Leo XIV served as Prior General for two terms. "This figure symbolically evokes Saint Augustine's words in the Confessions: 'Sagittaveras tu cor meum charitate tua' ("You pierced my heart with your love")," The open book, which symbolizes "the Word of God that transforms every human heart, as it did Augustine's." The White field behind the heart and book (in the papal arms rendered in ivory) recurs in many religious orders' heraldry as a sign of holiness and purity." Pope Leo XIV's motto—IN ILLO UNO UNUM ("In the One, we are one")—sits at the bottom of the coat of arms. The motto echoes St. Augustine's sermon on Psalm 127, where he explains that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one."

•St Rita of Cascia is commemorated on the 22nd May, and she is known as the "Patroness of Impossible Causes" for many of the wonders of God's providence worked through her prayers and intercessions. Married to an abusive husband, she is also known for her care towards those in difficult relationships as well. She is often depicted in iconography in a religious habit, for she took religious vows after the death of her husband. After death, her body was found to be incorrupt and a smell of roses surrounded her.
