•400<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations of the birth of St Oliver Plunkett at Loughcrew, Oldcastle A82 X4Y1 next Sunday, 29<sup>th</sup> June with Mass at 3pm. All welcome to mark the birth of this great saint who was born in our diocese.

•The Solemnity of Corpus Christi - The Body and Blood of Christ: This great feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264, and was traditionally celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday as a memorial of the Institution of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, but has been changed to the Sunday following in many countries, in order to allow a greater number of the faithful to participate.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ: In the Most Holy Eucharist and in the Church as the people of God. The primary purpose of this feast is to draw our focus more acutely to the Blessed Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the people of God who are the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his people. The Lord Jesus expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head, and we then make up the body. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church. The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others.

• <u>Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus: Friday, 27<sup>th</sup> June.</u> We celebrate the great feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following on from Corpus Christi, allowing us to meditate on the heart that has so loved us so perfectly. Images of the Sacred Heart from our homes can be brought to the 9:30am Mass for blessing. We continue to pray the Novena in preparation for this great feast.

Novena Prayer to the Sacred Heart: O Divine Jesus, who said, "Ask and you shall receive", I kneel at your feet. From whom shall I ask if not from you, whose heart is the source of all blessings. With a lively faith in you, I come to ask... Share your petitions silently with the Sacred Heart. I admit I am most unworthy of your favours, Jesus,

but this is not a reason for me to be discouraged. You are the God of mercies and you will not refuse a contrite heart. Look with pity on me, I beg you, and your compassionate Heart will find in my weakness a motive for granting my request. Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on me (x3) Amen.
