> • Tara to Slane Pilgrim Walk: 30th Aug: Bealach an tSolais. The annual pilgrim walk from the Hill of Tara to the Hill of Slane will take place on Saturday 30th August. This year marks the 25th anniversary of the first pilgrimage for the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000, and a beautiful way to celebrate this Jubilee Year of 2025. Tara is associated with our pre-Christian history while Slane, according to tradition, is the site where St. Patrick lit the Paschal Fire for the first time in Ireland. The walk is therefore a journey

towards the Light of Christ, the source of hope on our pilgrim journey through life. The walk is 15 miles (24 kms) long and winds along country roads through Skryne, Walterstown, and Beauparc, before crossing the Boyne at Slane. • Saints celebrated this week: (Aug 20th) St Bernard, Patron Saint of the Cistercian Order, Beekeepers, and Mountaineers. He had a closeness to Our Lady and wrote beautiful sermons on Mary.

(21st Aug) Pope St Pius X, gave permission for First Holy Communion to be given at the age of reason (aged 7/8). His Motto was to "Restore all things in Christ".

(22nd Aug). The Queenship of Mary, celebrated in the 5th Glorious Mystery of the Holy Rosary

Memorial of our Lady of Knock 17th August. On the rainy evening of August 21, 1879, in the village of Knock, County Mayo, fifteen faithful witnesses beheld a silent yet radiant vision at the gable wall of their parish church. In a scene bathed in heavenly light, they saw: The Blessed Virgin Mary, clothed in white, crowned in gold, hands raised in prayer, her gaze lifted toward heaven.

Saint Joseph, with reverently inclined toward Mary. **Saint John the Evangelist,** the youngest apostle,vested as a bishop, holding a book and gesturing toward an altar. Upon the altar stood **a Lamb,** symbolizing Christ, with a cross behind it, surrounded by angels. ★ The apparition lasted for two hours, during which the witnesses—young and old—stood in the pouring rain, praying the Rosary. Miraculously, not a drop touched the

vision itself. Though no words were spoken, the message was profound: a silent call to adoration, faith, and hope during a time of famine and hardship. The presence of the Eucharistic Lamb emphasized the centrality of Christ in suffering and redemption, and the Mass being the Source and Summit of the Christian life. Knock has since become a cherished Marian shrine, a place of pilgrimage and healing, where countless miracles have been reported — testimonies to the enduring grace of Our Lady of Knock. Prayer to Our Lady of Knock, Queen of Ireland, you gave hope to your people in a time of distress and comforted them in sorrow. You have inspired countless pilgrims to pray with confidence to your divine Son, remembering His promise, "Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find". Help me to remember that we are all pilgrims on the road to Heaven. Fill me with love and concern for my brothers and sisters in Christ, especially those who live with me. Comfort me when I am sick, lonely or depressed. Teach me how to take part ever more reverently in the Holy Mass. Give me a greater love of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Pray for me now and at the end of my death. Amen.
