
- <u>The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross</u>, celebrated today, honors the cross as the instrument of Christ's victory over death and the symbol of divine love and redemption.
- ★ Historical Roots: (A)It commemorates the discovery of the True Cross by Saint Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, around 326 AD. (B)The Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem was dedicated in 335 AD, and the cross was publicly venerated the following day (C) The feast also recalls the restoration of the Cross to Jerusalem after it was taken by the Persians and recovered by

Emperor Heraclius in 628 AD.

† Spiritual Significance: The celebration emphasises not the suffering of the Cross, but the love and mercy of God revealed through Christ's sacrifice. It invites believers to "lift up their gaze" and recognise the Cross as a tree of life, a source of hope and salvation. In essence, this feast transforms a symbol of death into one of eternal life, reminding Christians of the transformative power of divine love.
