Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord (6th January) Johnstown 9:30am

St Mary's Navan 8:00am, 10:00am and St Oliver's 7:30pm

The celebration of the great feast of the Epiphany, a Holy Day of Obligation celebrates the arrival of the Magi (The Three Wise Men or Three Kings) to Bethlehem representing all the nations of the world coming to meet the Lord. The word Epiphany means a revealing or manifestation and denotes the nations coming to worship Christ. Traditionally given as 3 in number because of their gifts, and depicted in art as three ages of humanity (Youth, Middle Aged and Elderly-notice the length and colours of their beards), and in skin tone the three known continents of the ancient world (Europe, Africa and Asia). The gifts that they present to the Infant Jesus also have symbolic meaning:



Gold: pointing to royalty and indicating that Jesus is King

Frank-Incense: offered by a priest in worship; it tells that Jesus our Lord is God.

Myrrh: A pungent strong-smelling ointment, used to anoint the body after death, foreshadowing the sacrifice of Jesus on Good Friday. It was this spice that the women brought to the tomb on Easter Sunday morning.

This beautiful feast helps us to realise that all people of every age and of every place are invited to know the love of God revealed in the Lord Jesus Christ, our



Saviour. For Eastern Christians, today is the day in which the celebrations for Christmas occur and presents are exchanged.

Still time to make some Spiritual Resolutions for 2026:

- Pray the Rosary daily for the intentions of the parish.
- Read/Study the Catechism of the Catholic Church
- Adopt a Patron Saint for this coming year to guide you, entrusting each day to his/her intercession
- Seek ways to become more intentional about your faith
- Choose a virtue to cultivate: humility, patience, generosity or charity – focus on one and track your growth.
- Fast intentionally: Not just food – consider digital fasting or giving up distractions.
- Make a monthly confession: Regular reconciliation brings clarity and grace.
- Create a Spiritual Plan of Life - Set a theme for the year: Like "Mercy" or "Discipleship" – let it guide your choices.
- Write out your goals: Include prayer, study, service, and sacramental life.
- Review monthly: Adjust and recommit with God's help.
- If Married, seek ways to deepen marital spirituality by praying together, taking time for a retreat together, cutting back on distractions that create distance.
- If single, seek the Lord's guidance in where He is asking you to follow Him.
- Whatever you decide, let it give glory to God.
